By completing several energy-saving projects with Neighborhood Power Project and other partners, Trilogy is estimated to save 97,226 kWhs and \$22,350 on their energy bills annually.

Trilogy

Project summary

Trilogy's mission is to provide comprehensive integrated care that enables people in mental health recovery to build meaningful and independent lives. In 2021 alone, Trilogy served 3,200 clients, experiencing a significant increase in demand for their services. As one of the first organizations to be accepted into Neighborhood Power Project (NPP), Trilogy continues to employ energy-efficient projects to save money and energy while expanding their impact throughout Chicago.

Trilogy's 42,000-square-foot building in Rogers Park contains spaces for an outpatient clinic, pharmacy, office and meeting rooms, kitchenettes, and restrooms. Before joining NPP, Trilogy had been working with Elevate to complete projects using incentives from ComEd. Along with funding from NPP and additional sources, Trilogy has focused their energy-saving projects on lighting retrofits and a rooftop unit replacement. Their efforts have resulted in considerable energy savings for their property.

Future projects recommended for Trilogy center on energy, water, and waste. These projects have the potential to result in even more energy savings for Trilogy, reducing operation costs so they can focus on furthering their mission in providing holistic mental health care.

Energy-saving improvements

- Interior lighting, exterior lighting, and exit sign retrofit
- Rooftop unit replacement
- Variable Frequency Drives (VFD) addition

Estimated annual savings

- \$22,350
- 97,226 kWhs

Project cost

- \$337,225 total project cost

Project funding

- \$16,500 grant from NPP
- \$28,046 in project incentives from ComEd
