
## ICNC **Project Summary**

The Industrial Council of Nearwest Chicago (ICNC) continues to advance their work in growing small businesses with the completion of several energy efficiency projects. The ICNC completed an exterior lighting install and established an electric vehicle charging station, demonstrating a commitment to electrification.

Future projects recommended for the ICNC include retrofitting interior LEDs, installing vending misers, and implementing a filtered water dispenser.

Department of Energy, LED light bulbs use at least 75% less energy, and last up to 25 times longer, than incandescent lighting.
