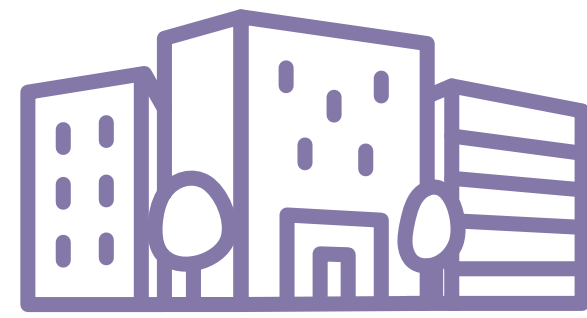


Neighborhood Power Project

Marillac St. Vincent Project Summary

Marillac St. Vincent Social Center (also known as Marillac House), is a community center in the heart of Chicago's West Side. The building, as part of the Marillac St. Vincent Family Services consortium, offers daycare, school classes, and before/after school care programs.

The Marillac House chose to make appliance upgrades to high-efficiency units, an investment that will help lower the facility's utility bills for years to come. The organization also prioritized installing air purifiers to maximize community members' health and safety in response to the coronavirus pandemic.

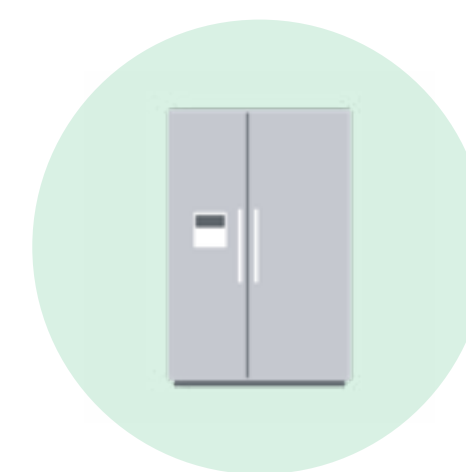

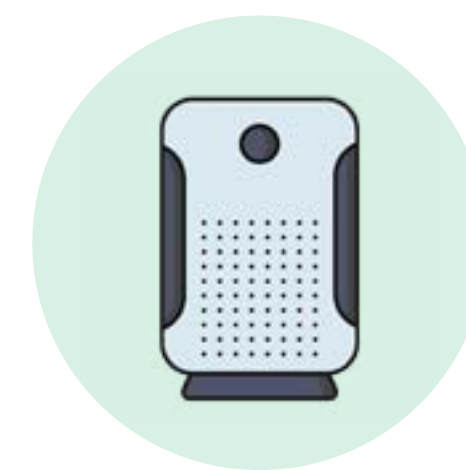
